(2 units of credit) for Undergraduates

■ 講義のねらい

英語圏の大学で教育を受けるのに十分な英語力を身につけることを目標とし、英語による口頭表現能力向上のための訓練を短期集中で行います。この授業は「英語スピーキング演習 GI」（学士課程の学生対象）という 100 番台の英語選択科目で、各 2 単位を取得できます。

■ Overall Course Objectives

The objective of this short-term intensive program is to train students in such a way as to increase their abilities in English oral expression, to the point where they can participate in tertiary education in the English-speaking world. The class has the overall title “Oral Expression in English GI”, and is directed at undergraduates. This is an English elective subject, and participants are eligible to receive 2 units of credit.

Classroom: Labo 2 (W3-4F)

Course Description: This five-day intensive course is designed for students looking for a forum that will allow them to speak English on a wide array of topics. It will be student-centered and (very) active participation will be expected. The general daily format is discussion/debate with presentations at the end of the day. Aside from general fluency, other areas that will be addressed include critical thinking skills, presentation skills, listening skills, and vocabulary building.

< Oral Expression in English GI 2> Code: LAE.E181-02

Dates: August 16, 17, 18, 21 and 22

Classroom: ZOOM

Course Description: This week-long intensive course is geared to those students wishing to improve their English oral expression skills, particularly discussion, debate, and presentation, through a comparative look at different countries around the world. The main subjects to be dealt with shall include world travel, comparative culture, education, health, welfare, and science and technology. The pair presentation will focus on a travelogue to a certain country, while the individual presentation will be about criteria for what can be considered the "best country." Critical thinking strategies will be emphasized as students become more effective speakers, with timely feedback given.

Textbook: All materials to be distributed online during class.

Evaluation: 50% Attendance and Class Participation, 20% Pair Presentation, 30% Individual Presentation

Dates: August 21 to 25

Classroom: M-134

Course Description: During this course, we will be exploring some techniques to help students with their future pursuits overseas; whether considering science-related subjects abroad, attending a language school to improve English skills or applying for an internship, this course is designed to help students to become a more confident writer and speaker. These classes will recreate the atmosphere of an authentic study abroad community. Students are advised to speak English as much as possible, to respect classmates by listening to

them carefully and helping them when they have problems. By the end of the course, students will have prepared an interview, a statement of purpose and a short presentation related to studying overseas.

Textbook: Instructor will provide hand-outs for each class.

Evaluation:

- One 500-word Statement of Purpose 35%,
- One-page reflection on interview performance 30%
- One-page feedback on presentations 35%

■ Overall Objectives of the 300-level Course

The objective of this short-term intensive course is to train undergraduate students in such a way as to increase their abilities in English oral expression, to the point where they can participate in tertiary education in the English-speaking world, or be active as members of international research communities in the near future. The course is titled “Oral Expression in English GIA”, and is directed at undergraduate students. This is an English elective subject, and participants are eligible to receive 2 units of credit.

Dates: August 28 to September 1

Classroom: M-134

Course Description: During this short course, students will explore some current science and technology issues to enhance their skills in oral communication. Via debates, presentations, interviews and short reports, students will examine topics in which they are interested with the goal of enhancing their ability to function – and hopefully thrive – in an English-language academic environment. Themes will include scientific ethics, innovation and Sustainable Development Goals. This is not a lecture-style class; students will collaborate with each other to actively build their knowledge and critical thinking abilities.

Evaluation: Debate summary: 50% , Presentation: 50%

1. 20 students in each class. Places are assigned on a first-come-first-served basis.
 2. Students are required to attend all dates.
 3. You may not enroll in multiple “Oral Expression in English GI” classes. (However, you may enroll in one of the three 100-level “Oral Expression in English GI” classes and in the 300-level “Oral Expression in English GIA.”)
 4. All three “Oral Expression in English GI” classes have the same level of difficulty.
 5. Students with IDs beginning with 23B (except for GSEP and credit students) may not enroll in the 300-level “Oral Expression in English GIA.”
 6. Graduate students can take undergraduate courses and earn credits but they are not included in graduate school requirements. Please take “Oral Expression in English GIII” for graduates.
 7. **Students who register/add the course via the Kyomu Web System but do not complete the Google Form application will not be able to take the course.**
